MR. ROGERS, EXAM. BY MR. HEBERT

- 1 Q. -- whether or not the government could have --
- 2 A. You got my answer.
- 3 <u>COMMISSIONER</u> I think he answered it.
- 4 MR. HEBERT All right. The next -- my final question
- is you have indicated that you were not aware of any
- 6 pressure from the P.M.O.'s office or the Prime Minister's
- 7 office. But can you state with any certainty that the
- 8 Prime Minister was not involved with respect to this
- 9 project; that, number one, that he did not support it;
- and, number two, that he did not lobby on behalf of the
- 11 company with certain Ministers? Can you state that he
- 12 didn't do those two things?
- 13 A. On -- from my knowledge, being very close to this
- 14 project, the answer is he did not.
- 15 Q. Right.
- 16 A. And I explained that yesterday --
- 17 O. All right. But it is --
- 18 Q. -- that he does not intervene on the side, for or
- against, propositions that would come at him day by day
- 20 to support this or that special interest or this or that
- 21 project.
- 22 O. Was it not common knowledge that Elmer MacKay had
- given up his seat for the Prime Minister to run and that
- the Prime Minister might have owed him a political
- 25 favour?
