- 1 provincial trade barriers across Canada between
- 2 provinces. And I thought it was a contradiction for an
- 3 Industry Department that was so concerned about that
- 4 issue, and rightly so, I think they're absolutely right
- 5 about that. There's no benefit to have these barriers
- 6 between provinces. I thought it was strange, indeed, that
- 7 that same province then was forcing the Premier and the
- 8 president of the Power Corporation to sign a piece of
- 9 paper saying that we are going to put a barrier up within
- 10 the province at the Canso Causeway. I just thought that
- 11 was a very contradictory stand for a department to take
- and that, on the record, has worked very hard to
- 13 eliminate trade barriers across -- across the country.
- 14 It seemed like a backward step to me. That was -- my
- 15 comment was about.
- 16 O. Let me come to another aspect of this whole
- 17 discussion that you and I are having about how the
- 18 Province was involved in this. And it relates a bit to
- 19 what we talked about yesterday at the end of your
- 20 evidence where you talked about the impact of politics on
- 21 deals, et cetera. And I asked you, I think yesterday,
- 22 you know, what can we learn from this? How can we make
- some transactions work the way they're supposed to with
- 24 appropriate political support? And how can we avoid
- other transactions being detrimentally affected,
