1 A. No, he didn't put it that way, but I'm sure you'd
2 feel pressure if you have a contract. You'd feel
3 pressure to meet the contract. I -- you know, but I'm --
4 I can't -- you know, I can't speak for him, but I would
5 assume that they would feel an obligation to meet that
6 contract.

7 Q. What connection would you have had had with the mine
8 itself and how it was progressing from, say, 1991 through
9 to May of '92? For example, would you on occasion visit
10 the mine property?

11 A. I visit -- under construction I used to go, you
12 know, a lot to see how -- you know, when they were doing
13 the original construction, the site preparation.

14 And, quite frankly, I think we have to put this in
15 context. I do that all the time. I'll stop and look at
16 the road construction coming home in Truro. Or when I'm
17 walking down the street in Boston I'll stop on my lunch
18 period and look at construction for 10 or 15 minutes.
19 It's just my very nature. So that wouldn't be unusual,
20 and I think that's important to understand that. I like
21 to see things built.

22 After -- you know, after the mine actually got
23 going, I wasn't there very much. I might drop in if
24 Gerald wanted to talk to me. I was in the mine once
25 after it was actually a mine.
