MR. CAMERON, EXAM. BY MAYOR PORTER

- 1 A. I don't remember any protests by Dr. Laffin. He was
- in the House prior to me being there, and after I
- 3 arrived, I don't remember any protests, but it could have
- 4 been. I just don't recall it.
- 5 O. Well, Mr. Cameron, yesterday you mentioned that you
- 6 had a role in arranging contracts for Pioneer Coal in
- 7 Westville.
- 8 A. That's not what I said either, Mr. Porter.
- 9 Q. Well, I'm sorry, I misinterpreted that then.
- 10 A. What I said was that in the context of the concern
- 11 that somehow we were going to take away the \$100,000 or
- 12 100,000 tonne contract with Nova Construction, I said
- 13 there was never any intent to take that contract away.
- 14 In fact, I lobbied with PICORD, and I had letters of
- 15 PICORD and others that urged the Power Corporation to
- 16 give him a full -- a firm contract so he could go ahead
- 17 and build a wash plant based on that. Before that, they
- 18 were just taking it as a need basis. And he was
- 19 concerned about making an investment of a wash plant on
- an as-needed basis.
- 21 So I remember PICORD and the community saying, "Look
- 22 we can have some permanent jobs here, and we want some
- 23 support to lobby for a permanent contract for Nova
- 24 Construction." That was in the context it was given.
- 25 O. Mr. Cameron, did you ever witness the clouds of coal
