12 Q. So in future weeks, if the Minister of Labour comes
13 to this Inquiry and tells that he tried to improve things
14 for his Department but couldn't get it through Cabinet or
15 get the support of the Premier of the day, you wouldn't
16 know anything about that?

17 A. I couldn't speculate on what the Minister will say
18 when he comes here, but, you know, it's -- I can't
19 speculate that's what he's going to say.

20 Q. You'd understand why we'd like to ask you now
21 because we're continually being told that we should have
22 asked this of the person that was here before, and I'd
23 just like to make sure that we cover this with you while
