1 A. I understand your comment, Commissioner.

2 MR. ROBERTS -- you've obtained these letters since,  
3 yourself?

4 A. From the Inquiry.

5 Q. From Mr. Merrick?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. And these are letters from Boudreau to the RCMP?

8 A. One letter from Mr. Boudreau to the RCMP and another  
9 letter back from the RCMP to Mr. Boudreau and MacEachern  
10 with a very, very interesting handwritten note on the  
11 side.

12 Q. What do they show, sir, in your view?

13 A. Well, do you want me to read them to you?

14 Q. Sure, if you have them. [Witness looking for  
15 letters]. If they're close at hand. The clock is  
16 ticking, Mr. Cameron.

17 A. Yes, maybe the Commissioner would give you another  
18 minute or two then for --

19 COMMISSIONER That would be breaking precedent.

20 A. Well, the handwritten note, I think is very  
21 interesting. It says, "Staff Sergeant Bishop, I don't  
22 know why the CO went to the Liberal Caucus for legal  
23 counsel, but Section 436 is interesting and we could --  
24 it could apply."
