1 substantiates your view that political partisanship
2 interfered in the police investigation --

3 A. I'm saying there seems to be --

4 Q. -- of the charges against Mr. Phillips?

5 A. There seems to be, when you have politicians writing
6 the RCMP demanding that people be charged under certain
7 sections -- I -- When I was Premier, lots of times
8 information would come to my attention that I felt may
9 not be proper and I would call the Attorney General's
10 office, talk to the Deputy Attorney General, and give
11 that information right away and ask him to relay it. I
12 never, in one way or other, ever told the RCMP they
13 should start an investigation --

14 Q. Okay.

15 A. -- and lay charges or anything else.

16 Q. Thank you. Coming back to your conversations with
17 Mr. Phillips, he wouldn't give you that correspondence
18 himself?

19 A. No.

20 Q. Now since the explosion, I take it you have talked
21 to Mr. Phillips about the causes of the explosion?

22 A. I'm sure, since the last four years, yes.

23 Q. Yes.

24 A. Yeah.

25 Q. And more than once, I would take it?
